

Acacia stenophylla

SHOESTRING ACACIA

Drought tolerance with willow-like habit and texture. Long gray-green modified leaflets grow from limbs with a weeping habit. Round cream catkin blooms appear in spring. These adaptable and durable trees have no thorns making them a popular landscape tree with many uses. Although immature trees appear wispy, as they mature, they develop a quite dense canopy which makes them conducive to using for backyard shade trees. Their typical natural habit of growing taller than wide makes them desirable for narrow spaces and streetscapes, but savvy designers know how to specify them where overhead obstructions don't exist. Regular water initially is helpful for establishment, but they develop drought tolerance as they mature. Pollinated flowers form pods which drop and cast seeds that can lead to some volunteer seedlings in optimal conditions.
