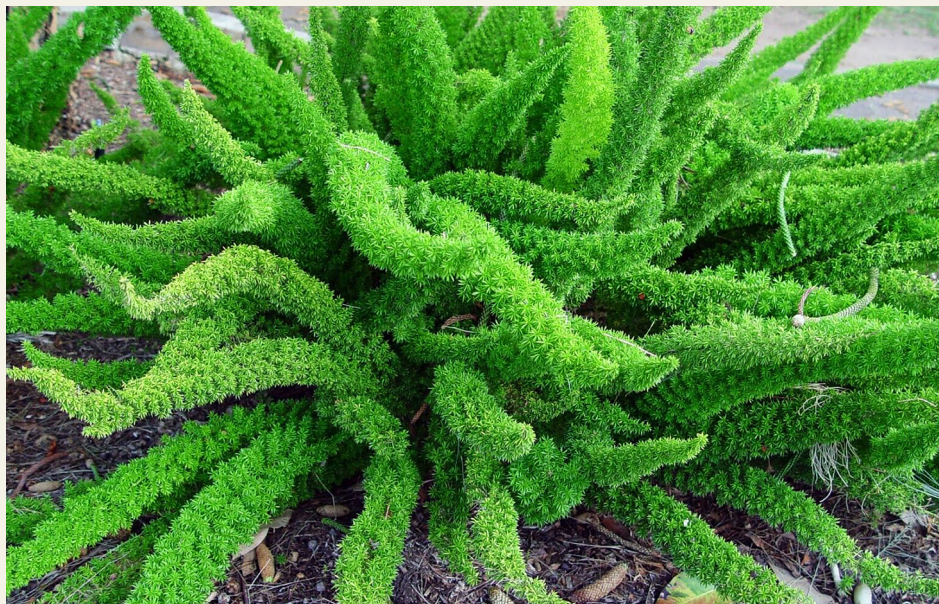









Asparagus densiflorus 'Myers'

(Syn. Asparagus meyeri)

FOXTAIL FERN

Great color & texture. Dense, conical-shaped bright green leaves grow out from a central cluster to form a spiky-looking but soft mound. In the low desert foxtail ferns prefer morning sun with afternoon shade and regular irrigation. They are tougher plants than they look and tolerate high heat if they have regular deep watering, especially during summer. They require little to no maintenance, other than clipping off old or yellowed leaves periodically. They work well in containers or as foundation plantings, mixed with other wide leafed tropical shrubs and offer striking silhouettes in raised beds.
