PLANT DETAILS

Cercidium microphyllum


(Syn. Parkinsonia microphylla)

FOOTHILL PALO VERDE OR LITTLE LEAF PALO VERDE

Native, durable Palo Verde. Slow growing brushy native trees found in Sonoran foothills and scrublands. Green bark matures to gray on larger, older specimens, but the canopy remains dense with bright green bark on the upper growth with tiny compound leaves. Their flowers are a pale-yellow color and typically the latest flowering Palo Verde. Easy to maintain, tolerate average rocky soils and require only modest amounts of water once trees are established. They develop size slowly, especially when grown in nursery containers, be patient and know that their initial small stature will change rapidly once trees are planted in their permanent home.
