



Cycas revoluta

SAGO PALM

Ancient bold evergreen accent plants. These are colloquially referred to as palms, but these plants are primitive Cycads. While they are relatively heat tolerant, hot, low desert afternoon sun should be avoided. It is also good to note that they grow naturally in wetter, tropical environments, which gives landscape designers a clue to provide them with loose, organically amended soils with good drainage and ample amounts of water during the growing season, with little to no supplemental water during the winter months when their growth virtually stops. The long dark green feather-shaped leaves are formed in whorled pattern around a center mound to eventually form a thick solid supporting trunk, however with a growth rate measured by inches per year, their development is painfully slow.
