Pistacia chinensis CHINESE PISTACHE

Medium to large growing leafy shade tree providing fall color. These trees are gaining in popularity due to their adaptability and moderate to fast growth habit. These are ornamental trees only and not nut producing. Landscapers and clients should be made aware that immature Chinese Pistache often look gawky and awkward with widely spaced, somewhat sparse branches. They are only in this "ugly duckling" stage for a while when first planted, as they quickly develop a strong root system they will fill out nicely to form an open irregular oval canopy. During spring and summer leaves are a lustrous, dark green, but their fall color show is what makes them special. In fall/winter the leaves turn bright orange and red tones just like deciduous trees do in the Midwest or northeast.
