Rosmarinus officinalis 'Prostratus' TRAILING ROSEMARY

Hardy, green groundcover with aromatic foliage. Rosemary plants have short needle-like, dark green resinous foliage that emits a distinctive fragrance, especially when the leaves are crushed. They are known and used commonly as rich culinary herb. This selection is a low growing form used as a groundcover, to trail over walls or raised beds, and for erosion control on slopes. They are heat and drought tolerant. They can be grown in some shade, but they perform best in full sun. They flower in spring with masses of tiny light sky blue flowers that are highly attractive to bees. They must be planted in well-drained soil but are not too particular about the pH. They are not fast growers but once planted they steadily spread, staying low to the ground and eventually grow into a mounded form.
