
AUTUMN SAGE

Durable, low bright flowered shrubs. Autumn sage blooms best during the later part of the year. Woody, small growing shrubs have bright to dark green round leaves that make the plant look soft and herbaceous. Flowers are borne on spires above the foliage. In their natural habitat, these plants occur under the dripline of larger evergreen shrubs or trees like mesquite or Acacia sp. where they're happy with filtered light or dappled shade. In low deserts they can tolerate full sun exposure, but they are no longer considered low-water use plants in hell-strip environments. They must be watered well if they are fully exposed, especially in summer in low deserts. Branches are brittle, so be gentle planting and when doing light pruning in late winter to early spring.
