


Yucca baccata

BANANA YUCCA

Bold, gray-green sword-leaved accent. So named for the large clusters of big succulents, fleshy oval fruits that looked like bananas to early explorers in the west. Before their fruits appear, thick flower stalks will form to hold big, cascading lush white and burgundy bell-shaped blooms that are visited by many pollinators but are only pollinated specifically by yucca moths. Their leaves are typically 2-3 ft. long at maturity forming around a basal clump, but rarely short trunked on older specimens. Low to no maintenance with only removal of old dry leaves or cutting off old woody flower stalks being needed. Good drainage is necessary. They will accept and grow faster with more water as long as the soil is well-drained.
